## PASTOR'S LETTER FEBRUARY, 2026

Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles.

And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfector of faith. (Hebrews 12:1-2)



Recently, I had a friend ask me what I'm going to "give up" for Lent this year. My first response was, "Lent is more than a month away." Then, my head started thinking of all the fun and delicious things I could put "on hold" during Lent: twizzlers, marshmallows, cotton candy, watching funny YouTube videos, etc. Then, I remembered that there was more to Lent than perpetual guilt and sadness. There is more to Lent than simply "giving up" certain parts of my life that I have no intention of "giving up" permanently.

Lent is forty-day season of discipleship that our ancestors of faith designated as a time of preparation for those seeking to be baptized. As time passed, Lent became a season in which the Church invited all believers to renew their focus and commitment to Jesus Christ. This year, Lent starts on Wednesday February 18 (Ash Wednesday). I hope that you can be part of the combined Ash Wednesday worship service (with Beth Eden UMC) at Aldersgate at 5:30 pm.

The writer of Hebrews offers an appropriate invitation for the season for Lent. On one hand, we're challenged to shed the layers of old sin ("Self-Inflicted Nonsense") that have entangled us. We're invited to "give up" everything that hinders us from following Jesus and becoming more like Him. So, if you're thinking of giving something up for Lent, then give up specific habits that harm your body, poison your mind, and undermine your ability to love God and others. If you're going to give something up, consider giving up unhealthy habits that serve as spiritual road-blocks and trip you up whenever you start gaining positive life momentum. Give up those habits that the Holy Spirit has been prompting you to "give up" long before this season ever began.

On the other hand, the writer of Hebrews also invites us to "run with perseverance the race marked out for us." This is an invitation to spiritual training. So, let's dust off our sneakers and hit the gym (spiritually speaking). If you're struggling to identify something to "give up," then "add on" daily disciplines like prayer, devotion, service for neighbors, journaling, and Scripture reading. Make it a priority to come and worship every Sunday. Join an existing small group or one of the Lenten Bible study groups on Wednesday at 10 am (in-person) or Sunday at 3 pm (Zoom). Find ways for you (and your family) to serve our neighbors in need. Renew your commitment to be a faithful steward of your finances. Consider adopting those holy habits that the Holy Spirit has been prompting you to "add on" long before this season ever began.
