PASTOR'S LETTER JANUARY, 2025

"...God has put the body together, giving greater honor to the parts that lacked it, so that there should be no division in the body, but that its parts should have equal concern for each other." (1 Corinthians 12:14-25)



"Away in a Manger "Merry Christmas! I pray that the joy and hope of our Savior's birth has filled your heart and home. Christmas is a day of celebration and connection. It's the day when God gave up the throne of heaven and came among us in a child born in Bethlehem. It's the day that God revealed God's humility and embraced a manger (a feeding container for animals) as his first bed. It's the day that God invited all of humanity (including the night-shift shepherds) to come and worship – as a sign of God's desire to connect and communicate with all of us. ALDERSGATE FINANCE NEWS FOR JANUARY 2025

Merry Christmas and Happy New Year. Our 2024 income was able to support all of our expenses. The additional income from the Trustees (\$20,000) and our Spacesharing of the parsonage (\$9,500) helped cover our expenses.

We have prepared our 2025 Budget. Our projected expenses are \$161,920.35. We have received 36 pledge cards totaling \$58,172 or about 35% of our budget. We understand that some choose not to pledge but do give faithfully. We will continue to share Pastor Hong with Beth Eden UMC. This allows each church to budget 50% of the Pastor's salary and related benefits. Apportionments are estimated to be \$18,612 for the year (included in the budget figure above).

The Finance Committee and Church Council have authorized the changing of our primary financial institution. We will now be banking with Northwest Bank, effective 1/1/2025. If you are currently giving your financial gift through the ACH process or are interested in using ACH, please contact me and I will share the new account number and routing number.

We are grateful for 2024 and look forward to 2025!!!

A HISORY OF THE ALDERSGATE UMC TOY MINISTRY

The following is a brief history of Aldersgate's Toy Ministry from 2012 to December of 2024.

2012 – Pastor Doug Williams dreams of making toys and giving them to children. He found the "Toymakers of East Lake UMC" in Florida and they were able to send patterns for Aldersgate to use.

On Father's Day, 95 toys were blessed and given to 3 agencies.

2014 – In the Spring, Aldersgate youth raised \$10,000 for a mission trip to Bolivia.

In August, 5 youth from Aldersgate took 20 toys each to give to children in need; a total of 100 cars. The youth going to Bolivia were Ashley Reynolds, Tara Glenny, Zach Wirtz and Kris and Shaun Perrot.

- 2016 On February 14, George Franklin, Bill Rhodes and Pastor Doug recorded at CBS Studio in downtown Chicago. The recording appeared on "Different Drummer"
- 2107 Aldersgate received a grant from the United Methodist Foundation and appeared on "Different Drummer".

In April of 2017, Pastor Doug and Lisa Williams took 300 toys on a mission trip to Kenya in Africa.

2024 – The goal for the last 3 years has been to make and distribute 1500 toy cars. We have met that goal and delivered the toys through the following agencies:


