The Aldersgate UMC Staff Parish Relations Committee is re-emphasizing a NO TOLERANCE Policy at Aldersgate UMC and on Aldersgate property.

Church leadership does not condone ANY verbal or physical attacks from church members, employees, regular participants and visitors directed at others within the church family, employees or visitors to the church.

Any incidents of verbal or physical altercations will be reviewed by SPRC. That committee will determine what, if any, actions need to be taken. Those actions include everything from a warning to a suspension to possible banishment from AUMC. The church will offer referrals to pastoral care or outside services, if necessary.

JULY FINANCE MESSAGE

Below is our budget financial status for January – May 2025:

Income: Expense: Deficit:

Y-T-D \$43,000.42 \$61,351.27 -\$18,350.85

The above expense figure does not include our invoiced apportionments for April & May, which totals \$2,730.00. To meet our projected budget (\$161,920.35), we would need to receive an average of \$3,114/week in current contributions. We are receiving an average of \$2,047/week in current contributions. We will be receiving rent for the parsonage starting June 1st, and this will help, but will not catch us up to meet our projected budget expenses.

If you would like to share your contributions bank-to-bank, contact me and I will get our current bank information (Northwest Bank of Rockford) to you.

I apologize that all of the Finance articles have a negative tone to them. I wish they were all more positive, but I would rather keep our finance information current/accurate on a monthly basis instead of surprising everyone at the end of the year with a large deficit.

We continue to be grateful for everyone's contributions to keep Aldersgate a positive presence.

TOY MINISTRY NEWS FOR JULY 2025


