Who are we as Aldersgate UMC? What are we good at? These are questions we have been asking ourselves as we brainstormed ideas for



reaching out to our neighbors. According to the Core Values of Aldersgate UMC, we are a family of God united in love and moved by the spirit of God committed to the ministry of compassion. As a congregation, we are proud of our loving, compassionate and friendly spirit. With this in mind, let's continue to challenge ourselves to get out of our comfort zone with our hospitality. Let's be a church family that offers radical hospitality for visitors and guests.

I want to thank our church leadership and congregation for your organization and support of Cruise Night on October 13. It was a chilly and windy afternoon, but those who came were blessed with friends, fun, and fellowship. We collected the refrigerator box full of winter-gear as well as cash donations of \$244 for local children. The Mission Committee will divide the donation and deliver them soon.

Cruise Night was a great example of how we can connect with our neighbors. I loved sharing the brochure with Wesley Willows residents and inviting them to join us for a fun event and support our local children.

Another fun outreach event was the Boo Bash on October 19. Thank you to Carmie Waugh, Jay Alms and others organizing this Halloween party for our church families and neighbors.

Thank you to everyone for supporting our missional events. On October 20, I joined Mike O'Hea and Mission Committee members for the annual Crop Walk, which strives to eradicate hunger. Thank you to our Crop Walk walkers and donors. Thank you also to everyone who contributed to the Hurricane Helene & Milton Relief fund. Your prayerful contributions will be sent to UMCOR (United Methodist Committee on Relief) who is assisting in recovery efforts.

As I reflected on the health and future of our congregation, my thoughts centered around the idea of radical hospitality. Aldersgate is a friendly church with kind greeters and welcoming congregation. Could we take another step to become a radically hospitable church? Could we become a church known for our extravagant love and care for guests and visitors?

Radical hospitality is an idea I learned about in 2016 at the Church of the Resurrection in Kansas City. It's an intentional effort by the entire congregation to help guests and visitors feel loved as soon as they step into our doors. For example, we could create guest-friendly visitor cards and prayer request cards. We can offer welcome bags for guests, as well as worship observation and reflection cards so that we hear the feedback of first-time visitors. I look forward to working on this effort with our Worship Committee and ask for everyone to do their part. You could join our team of greeters and ushers. You could also wear your name tags and go out of your way to greet newcomers. (Cont. on page 3)

What else can we do? Here are some ideas.

During Fellowship Time on Sunday, let's make sure we greet visitors. Even if you're not officially signed up as a greeter, greet people anyway. Share your name. Offer a friendly smile. Then, you can be creative. Ask guests about themselves and what brought them to AUMC. Ask if they have any questions or would like a tour of AUMC. You can introduce them to your circle of friends. You can even invite them to sit with you when they come back to church next week. The only thing you should not do is ignore them. Let's not forget our identity (core values). Let's embrace our church's mission.

I read that a newcomer decides within their first 7 minutes whether they will return to a church. This means that their most important interactions need to happen early. This also means that their return is less about the preacher and more about the congregation. It's less about what I do and more about what you all do – the impact you make. Every week, I do my best to connect with newcomers. I know you'll do your part too. Together, let's help all people feel welcome and loved at Aldersgate UMC.

Fall is a beautiful season. It's the time for harvest and family gatherings. It's a time for Thanksgiving and vibrant fall colors. At AUMC, November will be the time for our All Saints Day service, Veterans Day recognition, Memorial Dedications, Toy Ministry Blessings, and the Thanksgiving Sunday worship. Friends, there is so much to be thankful for. God has been so good to us. So, let's respond by living each day with gratitude. Let's serve as faithful reflections of God's goodness and grace.
