¹⁵ Speaking the truth in love, we will grow to become in every respect the mature body of Him who is the head, that is, Christ. (**Ephesians 4:15**)



Telling or hearing truth is never easy. We are taught from a young age to be honest, but as we get older, we learn to not be overly blunt or straightforward. Still, there are times when we to boldly speak the truth. The Bible teaches us to speak truth in love so that we can grow and be mature (Ephesians 4:15). While it takes time and intentionality to develop this skill, we can practice this in community. As we gather to pray, study, share, and serve, let's be people who listen to one another, encourage one another, and speak truth to one another.

We had a long summer this year. As I write this month's article, I am searching for thicker jackets to wear in the changing season. It's hard to believe that there are only 70 days left in 2025. The year has flown by quickly.

Personally, I am excited to share that I am in the 3rd semester of the Doctor of Ministry program. On one hand, I enjoy learning and being challenged theologically by peers and professors. It's okay to disagree with each other, but it's not okay to condemn one another. Let's not allow our differences to become obstacle in our care for one another as sisters and brothers in Christ.

I am thankful for those who are connecting with one another in small group gatherings like prayer meeting, Wednesday Fellowship Time, Anxious For Nothing study group and Prayer Pathway Workshop. Many of you are continue to meet in existing groups like AWED, Romeo, Bistro, and Toy ministry. I am proud of you and grateful for your devotion.


